ORDER DESIGNATING UNIVERSITY COMMONS LITIGATION FOR ELECTRONIC FILING AND SERVICE AND SCHEDULING STATUS CONFERENCE

The Panel has determined that it is appropriate for the University Commons

Litigation to be subject to electronic filing and service ("e-filing and service"). Pursuant
to West Virginia Trial Court Rule 15.02(c), the Panel ORDERS that all civil actions in
the University Commons Litigation shall be designated for e-filing and service beginning
on June 24, 2013, as provided in Trial Court Rule 15.01 et seq. All documents filed
prior to June 24, 2013, shall be filed in the Circuit Court of Monongalia County, West

Virginia. Additionally, any oversized documents that cannot be electronically filed and any documents that the Court orders to be placed under seal in the court file will be traditionally filed in the Circuit Court of Monongalia County, West Virginia.

Registration and training for e-filing and service is mandatory. If a party is not registered with File & Serve Xpress by June 24, 2013, the party will not receive e-service of documents in the University Commons Litigation. Even if a party has registered and received training for e-filing and service in other Mass Litigation cases, there will be specific training for e-filing and service in the University Commons Litigation that all parties must receive. Communications will be forthcoming from File & Serve Xpress regarding registration and training, but the File & Serve Xpress Customer Service Department may be reached at 1-888-529-7587 if you have any questions.

The Panel reminds the parties that, pursuant to Trial Court Rule 15.02(b), e-filing and service shall not be used to initiate a civil action or to serve a new party with an amended complaint or a third-party complaint.

The Panel further ORDERS that a Status and Scheduling Conference for the University Commons Litigation will be held at 10:00 a.m. on July 9, 2013, in the Circuit Court of Taylor County, West Virginia, in Judge Alan D. Moats' Courtroom on the Second Floor, located at 214 W. Main Street, Grafton, West Virginia 26354. The Panel judges assigned to the University Commons Litigation will preside. All counsel of record and any self-represented parties are ORDERED to attend and shall be prepared to discuss:

- Appointment of Liaison Counsel;
- Pro hac vice admissions;

- Status of pretrial discovery;
- Status of pending discovery motions and dispositive motions;
- 5. Proposed trial schedule;
- 6. Prior mediation and status of settlement negotiations; and
- Status of implementation of electronic filing and service.
