Dear valued File & Serve client,

After several years of piloting **electronic filing** (e-filing), the Maricopa County Superior Court has announced the implementation of a new court based e-filing system designed and managed by the Clerk of Court's office. The new system allows e-filing directly via the Clerk of Court's system or using e-filing through designated providers.

As of **September 8, 2008**, LexisNexis File & Serve will no longer be available for efiling court documents with Maricopa County.

## Don't panic!

Note that the court rules still allow for electronic service (e-service) to be implemented and used in cases as a way to maintain online case files and facilitate service amongst the parties in an action. **This means that your firm can continue to use File & Serve for e-service** in all the cases that are currently online and any future cases where you'd prefer to use e-service with File & Serve!

You can continue to recognize the significant case management, productivity and cost savings benefits associated with e-service in all of your cases.

Reasons to continue to use File & Serve e-service:

- 1. No learning curve!
- 2. No interruption of access!
- 3. No missed documents!

What happens if law firms do not continue using File & Serve e-service?

- 1. Your documents on File & Serve will not be migrated to the designated efiling providers; however, you will be able to access historical files (documents on File & Serve) even after September 7, 2008.

How to ensure File & Serve e-service will continue?



- 1. Parties should file a motion or stipulation (see attached) that agrees to continue using File & Serve e-service in each case (we recommend plaintiff [or plaintiffs'] firms file the motions or stipulations).
