



### Active Cases

Pending – all cases that are active that have not been placed on the Inactive Docket

Stay – all cases that have been placed on the Inactive Docket.

### Terminated Cases

Settled or Dismissed Prior to Trial – all cases that have been completely resolved through settlement or dismissal

Other Termination – all cases that are Administratively Dismissed as to all parties. If any Bankrupt Defendants were in the case at the time of the Administrative Dismissal, the case should be reported as a Bankruptcy Stay.

Bankruptcy Stay – all cases that are resolved except as to bankrupt defendants, including those cases in which there were bankrupt defendants at the time when the case was Administratively Dismissed.

Those cases which have been Administratively Dismissed or which have been placed on the Inactive docket can be reactivated upon motion by Plaintiff's counsel, provided that the requirements of the Court Order or Statute which resulted in the Administrative Dismissal or the placement on the Inactive Docket have been met. There will be no filing fees charged by the Clerk of Courts for the reactivation of a case that has been Administratively Dismissed or that had been placed on the Inactive Docket.

Once this reporting has been accomplished, File & Serve will provide to each law firm representing Defendants a list of the active cases in which at least one of that firm's clients is listed as a Defendant. Counsel for Defendants are Ordered to work with File & Serve to update this list to accurately reflect the cases in which each of the clients of their law firm remain as an active party. By verifying that a particular Defendant still remains in a particular suit, defense counsel is not deemed to have entered an appearance on behalf of that Defendant in that particular case, nor is defense counsel waiving any objections that any Defendant may have with regard to statute of limitations, service or any affirmative defense.

While this exchange and update of information is taking place, counsel for Defendants are ordered to update the information regarding each of their clients in each of the cases that currently have a trial date. These records are to be updated within 90 days from the date of this order. This will be done by using the "Case and Party Management" tool located in the Toolbox on the File & Serve home page. If a Defendant is voluntarily dismissed or has its motion for summary judgment granted, the defense firm will update the Case and Party Management screen to indicate that the Defendant is dismissed, attaching the appropriate document. If a Defendant settles a case, the defense firm will attach a form letter indicating the name of the Defendant, the name of the Plaintiff and


that the matter is settled. No other details regarding the settlement of the case will be included in that letter.

From the date of this order going forward, each defense firm will be responsible for maintaining and updating on File & Serve changes in the information regarding the status of the Defendants that it represents in each case. Because the Court will be relying on this data being kept up to date in order to accurately report to the Ohio Supreme Court on the status of the asbestos litigation, it is ORDERED that each defense firm update the Case and Party Management information within 10 days of any change in the status of one of their clients. Similarly, if there is a change to the status of the entire case, Counsel for Plaintiff is to notify the Court within 10 days so that the case status may be updated by the Court. If additional time is needed, counsel should contact the Court.

MASTER DOCKET

All documents filed to the Master Docket (In Re: Cuyahoga County Asbestos Case, Special Docket No. 73958) shall be deemed to be filed in all cases in which that attorney represents a party. Thus, it is no longer necessary for File & Serve to associate each attorney with specific parties to the cases on the Master Docket.
